  - a. Paul, an apostle. (1)
    - 1. By the will of God.
    - 2. According to the promise of life in Christ.
  - b. To Timothy, the beloved son. (2)
  - c. Grace, mercy and peace. (2)
- II. Paul's Constant Prayerful Thanks for Timothy. (3-7)
  - a. Paul's service to God. (3)
  - b. Paul remembers Timothy's tears. (4)
    - Causes him to want to see Timothy.
    - > So he might be filled with joy.
  - c. Paul is reminded of Timothy's faith. ((5)
    - Dwelt first in his grandmother Lois and his mother Eunice.
    - Now dwells in Timothy.
  - d. Paul reminds Timothy to rekindle the gift of God that is within him. (6-7)
    - > He should do this because of his faith. "Wherefore..." (6)
    - > Gift came by laying on of Paul's hands. (6)
    - > The spirit God has given us: (7)
      - a. Not a spirit of timidity.
      - b. A spirit of power.
      - c. A spirit of love.
      - d. A spirit of self-control.
- III. Special Exhortations to Timothy. (8-14)
  - a. Timothy was not to be ashamed. (8)
    - > Of testifying of our Lord.
    - Of Paul, the Lord's prisoner.
  - b. Timothy to take his share of suffering. (9)
    - > Suffering is for the gospel.
    - > Suffering is "according to the power of God".
      - a. The God who saved us.
      - b. The God who called us with a holy calling.

- c. Timothy is reminded of the means and purpose of God's calling and salvation. (9-10)
  - > It was not based on our works. (9)
  - It was based on His own purpose and grace. (9-10)
    - a. A grace given in Christ Jesus ages ago. (9)
    - b. A grace now made known and manifested through the appearing of Christ Jesus our Saviour. (10)
      - i. Jesus who abolished death.
      - ii. Jesus who brought two things to light:
        - 1. Life.
        - 2. Immortality.
      - iii. Brought through the gospel.
- d. Paul's relationship to the gospel. (11-12)
  - > Paul's appointments: (11)
    - a. Preacher.
    - b. Apostle.
    - c. Teacher.
  - > This is the reason for his suffering. (12)
  - Paul is unashamed of his suffering because of his confidence in God (Christ). (12)
    - a. Paul knows God.
    - b. Has confidence God will guard the entrustment until that day.
- e. Timothy is to follow and guard. (13-14)
  - Follow (hold fast) the pattern or form of sound words. (13)
    - a. Heard from Paul.
    - Follow in the faith and love which are in Christ Jesus.
  - Guard (keep) the truth (the "good thing committed to him")
    (14)
    - a. The truth that was entrusted to him.
    - Kept or guarded by Timothy through the indwelling Holy Spirit.
- IV. Paul's Experiences In Asia. (15-18)
  - a. "All" turned away from Paul in Asia. (15)
  - b. Mercy requested for the household of Onesiphorus. (16-18)
    - > He "refreshed" Paul. (16)
    - > He was not ashamed of Paul's bondage in chains. (16)
    - > He searched diligently and found Paul in Rome. (17)
    - Timothy knew how greatly this man assisted Paul while Paul was at Ephesus. (18)
