- o Peter's reference to himself. (1)
 - An elder and a witness of the sufferings of Christ.
 - A "partaker of the glory that shall be revealed".
- o Exhortation to the elders. (2-4)
 - "Feed the flock"--be a shepherd. (Psalm 23) "Taking the oversight". (1)
 - Responsibilities lie in the "meaning of various terms" referring to the leaders of the church.
 - "Elders" (Presbuteros)
 - "Bishop" or "overseer" (Episkopos)
 - · "Shepherd" or "pastor". (Poimen)

- In all relationships—humility. (5-6)
- Leave cares with God. (7)
- "Be sober (sound thinking), be vigilant (watchful) because..." (8)
- Resist the devil. (9)
